There's a problem with this way of thinking. It doesn't matter how large or small we may think our sin is, its what God thinks of it that matters. Sin to God is sin. He will not tolerate any of it – not even a microscopic amount. His standard is perfection.

So, should we give up and sin boldly? No there are consequences. Our biggest need is to be forgiven by God who made us and will judge us.

The good news for us is that God is prepared to forgive. He is gracious and merciful, slow to anger and full of love. He hasn't given up on us. He made forgiveness possible by paying the ultimate price: the sacrifice of his son Jesus on the cross.

Jesus' sacrifice happened only once but it 'fits all' people and it can deal with all sins ... past, present and future. No matter who you are or what you've done. Whether you've driven over the speed limit, cheated on your tax return, committed adultery or taken a human life, God can forgive all through Jesus' blood. God's forgiveness is open to all people. But we need to ask for it. We need to ask God with hearts ready to turn from evil and ready to live under God. One thing is certain, God is 'ready to forgive'.
