Elise explains the symptoms of her disease: *"We crave affirmations from our peers in the form of 'likes', 'favou*rites', 'shares', 're-tweets', 're-blogs, and 're-vines'." *"It's almost as if we become irrelevant without loads of Internet attention."* She says.

Is everyone on Facebook like this? Probably not! But what's common is that most users are overwhelmingly selective in what they share. People highlight the positives while downplaying (or ignoring) the negatives.

Why do we do this? Why do we work so hard on social media to create these shiny, friendly, interesting, online, pixelated pamphlets to market ourselves? The answer is a mixture of vanity and low self-esteem. The result is plastic portraits talking to other plastic portraits with hardly anyone connecting on a real level.

What if things were different? What if instead of FakeBook we all had RealBook accounts? And, instead of choosing what we share, a team of photographers and videographers documented our lies and secret shames and published them with all the polish of a top marketing firm.

And in between the scandal... gripping news about 'Bills paid on time' ... and then ... 'Frustrations at work lead to big move' and (wait for it) 'Dishwasher packed and then (gasp!) unpacked again'.

RealBook would be embarrassing on every level: it would highlight our
